Indian garments carry our values and traditions that are passing generations to generations. From a long period of time, we have many traditional garments that symbolise the great and ancient culture of India. Now, a day's traditional garments are in high demand, not only in India but overseas too. People all over the world like to dress up like ancient Indian royals. These things give a high demand for traditional garments makers in the garment industry. There are greater money-making and career-making opportunities for those professionals who know the technology of Indian garments making. Direct drafting is a technique where you don't have to go through the long process of basic pattern to the final drafting. In this, we will make the direct draft of the garment. We don't have to use basic bodice and manipulate it to the final draft. To use these drafting methods, you need to know the basics of pattern making. In this book, all the drafting methods are simple and very easy to use, but still, you need basic knowledge to understand the terminologies which I used in it. You can also need a little basic knowledge of mathematics as we use some mathematics techniques in drafting, which I will show you in worksheets at the end of this book. This is a little advanced course for those who have some knowledge of pattern making and want to gain knowledge in direct drafting of Indian garments. This book is not for those who want to work in or are already working in export houses or bigger manufacturing units. Our course is for those who want to learn themselves or who want to learn to start their small business for their clients or who want to run small boutiques or who want to learn traditional garments making as a hobby. In this course, we are going to provide you the technology of pattern making as this is an essential part because once the fabric is cut with right measurement and with right pattern, everything is done. Then the stitching part just needs your practice on a sewing machine. There is no hardcore science in it. In this course, we selected a few of Indian traditional garments which are very high in demand and need much basic knowledge about pattern making. Nothing is easy to learn until you are not going to make it in practice.

This text offers a complete picture of the process of individual garment construction following the exact techniques used in the industry. The unique feature of this book is its presentation of each garment as a whole concept with numerous diagrams and easy-to-follow instructions. Students master the principles of design and flat pattern to create an individual item of apparel. Each chapter begins with the introduction of a basic sloper and follows with an explanation of the whole production process, making a garment from pattern drafting to garment construction, including lining, interfacing, and markers.
